You may have noticed a few changes in our school. Ms. Elizabeth Lavoie is our new grade 1/2 teacher and Mrs. Lisa Swain is our new secretary. Parents, thank you for discussing what our new normal looks like and having a positive attitude towards our school's safety measures. Your support and encouragement is essential to your child's success.



Student Absenteeism & Tardiness

When a student is late it interferes with the teacher's ability to conduct the class and the ability of other students to benefit from the instruction. If your child will be late or absent, please call the school prior to 8:45 a.m. We do have an automated service that will call you if your child is not present and has not already been excused by a phone call from you to the school. However, because we are using a new student data program this year called My School Sask (M.S.S.), there have been some unforeseen glitches in the communication between M.S.S and the Safe Arrival attendance app. We hope to have this fixed shortly.

Student Fees

All Student fees are now due - Cheques are payable to St. Louis Public School.

All student fees are required to be paid in full (including fees from past years that have not been paid) for students to participate in Graduation cap and gown ceremony.

Pre-Kindergarten – no fees.

Kindergarten: \$15.00 to pay for crayons, pencils (school supplies) and tissue.

Gr. 1 to 7: \$30.00 to pay for holiday crafts such as Christmas, Easter, Valentine's Day, Mother's & Father's Day and for field trips during the year. Please note that if there is more than one field trip a note will be sent home with the amount owing.

Gr. 8 – 12: \$30.00 to pay for tissue, special projects and curricular trips.

<u>Caution Fees</u>: Grade 7 only: \$25.00. (reimbursed upon graduation if no books have been lost or damaged and accounts are nil).

P.A.A. Fees: Gr. 7 - \$20.00

Gr. 8 -12 - \$25.00

Graduation Fees: Gr. 12 \$50.00

Registration Forms – all students must have a current registration form, including returning students

In past years we have sent home a pre-filled registration form that required parents/guardians to verify the information only. The new student data program called My School Sask (M.S.S.) that we started using this year is not set up to do that. Registration forms were sent home with students the first week of school. If you didn't receive one to fill out, please contact your child's teacher, the office, or visit our website and fill one out online.
