


How To:

The St. Louis Branch Wapiti Public Library held its 2021 Annual General Meeting (AGM) on Tuesday, April 13th, 2021 via the ZOOM app. Due to covid restrictions and to keep contact to a minimum, meeting details were emailed out and AGM packages delivered to all pre-registered participants a few days prior to the AGM. Other than a few audio glitches at the start of the meeting, this first attempt at a virtual AGM worked quite well. Future board meetings will continue to be held via the Zoom app until covid restrictions are lifted. Because of the covid closures in March of last year, the 2020 AGM was cancelled. This year's 2021 AGM covered two years of reports and financials. Agenda items included:

- circulation & programming stats for 2019-2020-2021 including Indigenous/Aboriginal Storytelling month activities;
- results of the 2019 and 2020 fundraising;
- financials for 2019-2020-2021:
- board chair & librarian reports;
- covid update with a review of the 2020 library closures; suspension of in-person programs & public computer access; the move to on-line programming; patron & staff safety protocols implemented;
- resolved security issues with the installation of the camera & remote access buzz-in system on the external school library doors;
- possible upcoming projects for 2021-2022 under continued covid restrictions;
- board elections.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank the community volunteers leaving the board and welcome the newly elected/appointed board members for 2021-2022.

Our sincere gratitude and thanks to Village of St. Louis rep and board chair Joan Boyer, who decided not to run again after several years as chair. Her wise counsel and steady hand guided us through several library improvements and the past year of covid upheaval. Thanks also to RM of St. Louis councillor/rep Raymond Parent for representing the interests of rural residents and the communities of Hoey, Domremy, Saint Isidore-de-Bellevue. 
ZOOM with the St. Louis Branch Library Book Club
